NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT AND PUBLIC HEARING

***PROPOSED 2017-A PLAN FOR THE ALLOCATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF
REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITIATIVE AUCTION PROCEEDS***

The Rhode Island Office of Energy Resources (OER) proposes the 2017-A Plan for the Allocation and Distribution of Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative Auction Proceeds (2017-A Plan) and gives notice of intent to hold a public hearing to receive public comment on the proposed Plan and to afford interested parties an opportunity to submit data, views, or arguments orally and/or in writing on the proposed 2017-A Plan.

The public hearing will be held on **June 1, 2017 at 10:00 a.m.** in Conference Room C, Second Floor of the Powers Building, One Capitol Hill, Providence Rhode Island. The hearing room is accessible to the handicapped. The Department of Administration will provide interpreter services for the hearing impaired, provided such a request is made at least three (3) business days prior to the hearing date. Requests for such services may be made in writing or by calling TTY (711) or (401) 222-5300.

The proposed 2017-A Plan allocates and distributes the Rhode Island Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative Program proceeds from the last two auctions held in 2016.
